WELBURN CHURCH ORGAN FUND - ADOPT A FATHER WILLIS ORGAN PIPE

The organ in St John's, Welburn Church was built around 1875 by the celebrated firm of Henry Willis & Sons. Henry Willis is generally regarded as the greatest organ builder of the nineteenth century and his role in developing the modern English organ earned him the title "Father" Willis. Tonally unaltered examples of his work are rare, and the historical value of ours at Welburn was recognised in 2017 when the British Institute of Organ Studies awarded it a Historic Organ Certificate.

After nearly 150 years of unfailing service the organ is now partly infested with woodworm and is in general need of repair. Restoration will cost in the region of £80.000 and the "Adopt a Father Willis Organ Pipe" scheme is part of Welburn Church's effort to raise that sum.

Each of the organ's 879 pipes will need to be checked over, cleaned, and repaired as necessary. You will be able to adopt one pipe, a number of pipes, or a complete "rank" (row) of pipes – the choice is yours – and whichever pipe(s) you adopt will be exclusive to you. If you are a taxpayer, you can also Gift Aid your donation increasing its value by 25%.

Each keyboard on the Welburn organ has its own rank of pipes. There are 58 pipes per rank for the Great and Swell Organs (lower and top keyboards) and 30 pipes for the Pedal Organ (played by the feet). The number after the name of each rank (i.e. Principal 4) is the length in feet of the largest pipe.


